SPPF SCHOLARSHIP POLICY Department of Chemical Engineering FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS ENROLLED IN PAPER ENGINEERING OR BIOPROCESS ENGINEERING AT THE SUNY COLLEGE OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE AND FORESTRY Adopted June 30, 2022

The Syracuse Pulp and Paper Foundation, Inc. ("<u>SPPF</u>") generally awards two types of scholarships to undergraduate students enrolled in Paper Engineering, Bioprocess Engineering at the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry ("<u>SUNY ESF</u>"): (1) Scholarships based on a student's academic performance, including grade point average (<u>GPA</u>) (the "<u>Academic Scholarships</u>"), and (2) certain sponsored scholarships, including the Grossman, Oechsle, Alexander and Kamala-Devi Scholarships (the "<u>Sponsored Scholarships</u>"). The Academic Scholarships are based on academic merit and awards vary based on class level and cumulative GPA. The Sponsored Scholarships are based on a variety of factors, such as socioeconomic status and demonstrated leadership, as set forth in each of the Sponsored Scholarships foundational documents. The Academic Scholarships and the Sponsored Scholarships are renewed each semester, subject to the approval by the SPPF Board of Directors.

The following are the rules and requirements of the Academic Scholarships:

1. Students must be enrolled as a Sophomore, Junior or Senior in the Department of Chemical Engineering at SUNY ESF and demonstrate satisfactory progress toward a B.S. degree in Paper Engineering, as defined by the list of students enrolled in the Department of Chemical Engineering provided by the SUNY ESF Director of Financial Aid, including credit hours completed, cumulative GPA and country of origin. A student must be in the Paper Engineering Program at the time of the initial Academic Scholarship and at all times throughout the term of the Academic Scholarship. If a student fails to stay enrolled in the Paper Engineering Program, any remaining unpaid portion of the Academic Scholarship will be forfeited and stopped.

2. Scholarships are available to U.S. citizens and permanent residents as determined by the SUNY ESF Director of Business Affairs.

3. To receive the Scholarship, students must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale and sign the release form in the Banner system to allow release of GPA, country of origin and completed course credits to establish progress to graduation.

4. Students enrolled in Paper Engineering and maintaining a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale will receive a \$1,000 disbursement per full-time semester, up to six (6) semesters, from the bursar. Disbursements are made to the bursar for the scholarship each semester based on the applicable Academic Scholarship rules.

The following are the rules and requirements of the Sponsored Scholarships:

1. Each awardee of a Sponsored Scholarship must comply with terms of its specific foundational documents, including, but not limited to, any Scholarship Endowment Agreement.

2. Students must be enrolled in Paper Engineering or Bioprocess Engineering in the Department of Chemical Engineering at SUNY ESF and demonstrate satisfactory progress toward a B.S. degree in Paper Engineering or Bioprocess Engineering, as defined by the Department of Chemical Engineering in consultation with the SPPF Scholarship Committee and the SPPF Board of Directors. A student must be in the Paper Engineering or Bioprocess Engineering Program at the time of the initial Sponsored Scholarship and at all times throughout the term of the Sponsored Scholarship. If a student fails to stay enrolled in the Paper Engineering or Bioprocess Engineering Program, any remaining unpaid portion of the Sponsored Scholarship will be forfeited and stopped.

3. Scholarships are available to U.S. citizens and permanent residents as determined by the SUNY ESF Director of Business Affairs.

4. To receive the Scholarship, students must sign the release form in the Banner system to allow release of GPA, country of origin and completed course credits to establish progress to graduation.

5. Disbursements are made to the bursar for the scholarship each semester based on the applicable Sponsored Scholarship rules.

Please note that the Grant program may be changed per the recommendation of SPPF's Scholarship Committee and SPPF Board of Directors. Awards may vary per semester based on available resources.
