Grant for B.S. Graduates of Paper Engineering Undergraduate Programs SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry Department of Chemical Engineering Adopted June 30, 2022

The Syracuse Pulp and Paper Foundation, Inc. (SPPF) offers grants (the "Grants") to undergraduate students who have graduated from the Department of Chemical Engineering at SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry ("SUNY ESF"). The total Bachelor of Science Degree award is \$15,000. An additional award of \$5,000 is available to Paper Engineering majors who complete the SUNY ESF Management Minor. The Grants are available to eligible graduates by application based on the below eligibility requirements. Interested students should apply prior to the student's date of graduation by email to deb@sppf-esf.org, including (1) an SPPF application certifying the student's eligibility; (2) a current resume; and (3) a current undergraduate transcript (unofficial is fine).

- 1. Successful completion of a B.S. degree program in Paper Engineering, and, if applicable, the Management Minor, at SUNY ESF as defined by the list of students enrolled in the Paper Engineering major of the Department of Chemical Engineering provided by the SUNY ESF Director of Financial Aid (including credit hours, GPA, etc.);
- 2. Maintenance of a final, cumulative undergraduate GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale and sign the release form in the Banner system to allow release of GPA, country of origin and completed course credits to establish graduation progress; and
- 3. Must be a U.S. citizen and permanent resident as determined by the SUNY ESF Director of Business Affairs.

All Grants will be paid by check to the student-grantee <u>after the student-grantee graduates from</u> <u>SUNY ESF and upon submission by the student-grantee to SPPF of the student-grantee's final, official undergraduate transcript.</u>

Please note that the Grant program may be changed per the recommendation of SPPF's Scholarship Committee and SPPF Board of Directors. Awards may vary per semester based on available resources.
