It is amazing how far reaching the impact has been of the pandemic isolation as we work to rebuild our communities and our lives.

The Department of Chemical Engineering continues to see a decline in enrollment, fall 2022 had 3 first year Paper Engineering students, 7 Bioprocess Engineering students and no Renewable Materials Science enrollment. Chemical Engineering as a major had 4 First year students. This decline in enrollment post covid has been a trend in NYS although total ESF enrollment has been up slightly.

To address this decline SPPF has taken on a major redesign of the Scholarship program to ensure funding students directly through grants and a substantial increase to overall funding of the college degree. We have also begun to expand our internship grant program to attract other majors to the Paper industry as we market the opportunities that impact the world we live in to protect the environment while achieving a rewarding career.

SPPF supported 27 students with 44 scholarships or grants along with conference support and seminars investing over \$140,000 directly to undergraduate and graduate students. Students participated in 3 conference events this year:

- Six students went to the AICHE conference in Phoenix, Arizona
- Twenty one students went to the TAPPI Student Summit in Cincinnati, Ohio
- Eight students attended the TAPPI/PIMA conference in Glens Falls, New York

SPPF has also sponsored the "Order of the Engineer" induction with the graduation ceremonies annually as well as various events with company interviews and alumni speakers during the year. Many of these are described in various committee activities in the annual report.

All of the Paper Engineering Seniors were employed in the industry and one Bioprocess graduate choose a paper career – 10 graduates were placed for 100% employment at graduation. Fifteen students were placed in summer employment this year.

Looking ahead, we are spreading the good news of career opportunities with a Syracuse Pulp and Paper Foundation table at the SUNY ESF Career Fair October 2023 to share the various job titles and opportunities in the Pulp, Paper and allied industries across campus – it is not just Walters Hall!

With this report, I want to announce that my tenure as SPPF President will come to an end at the Fall Board Meeting in September. It is a two-year posting to allow for new leadership to be consistently worked through the Board. The foundation is very focused on our mission of supplying the very best graduates to the Pulp & Paper Industry and I have been exceptionally impressed with the students I have met and know that they are well prepared for success in their respective careers. The Paper Industry is finally getting recognized as a Green Industry and a very good alternative to plastic. More and more recyclable products are being developed every day and getting well qualified students into this field is our mission. I have enjoyed my time as president and will continue serving the Board. I look forward to the future and how SPPF can continue to aid in the placement of graduates into our industry.

Thank you to all the companies and members for the support to students with scholarships, grants and employment. Graduates of the Paper Engineering program continue to have the lowest debt at graduation, highest employment record and highest salaries across the SUNY ESF programs.

The SPPF Today


The Syracuse Pulp and Paper Foundation was established in 1960 to encourage young people to enroll in the Paper Engineering programs at the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry. The idea came from alumni and paper industry executives who saw the need for a steady stream of talented, well-trained engineers coming into the industry. The founders thought the best way to attract exceptionally talented young people to our field was to offer scholarships to deserving students enrolled in Paper Science or Paper Engineering. Today the program is Paper Engineering in the Department of Chemical Engineering.

The Board of Directors includes executives in the pulp, paper and allied industries. The work of the foundation is shared by standing committees composed of directors, corporate representatives, individual members, and SUNY ESF administration with key faculty members. This interaction between the college and the industry helps to keep the curriculum current and representative of industry trends.

The SPPF office welcomes recruiters and hosts several companies for information nights and interview days. We appreciate the corporate support and the successful 100% employment of our graduating seniors and support to internships for sophomores and juniors. The Paper Engineering curriculum requires a 12-week industrial internship which is paid by employers and SPPF has enhanced this with a grant of \$2,000 upon successful completion of the internship. Students may apply for SPPF grants of up to 2 intern experiences. The directors of SPPF realize successful internships and added exposure to a variety of roles will enhance the educational experience.





SPPF Annual Department Report

Assistant Professor, Paper and Chemical Engineering SPPF Faculty Liaison



In 2022, ESF initiated a strategic planning initiative to evaluate and update the college's missions and goals. The final working draft was submitted in April 2023 for a review. In the plan, three Institutional pillars were proposed. They are growing opportunities for student success, transdisciplinary scholarship and research

expansion and intentional cultivation of community and belonging. Each Pillar has two themes, and each theme has multiple goals. Tasks and actionable items associated with each goal will be shared at implementation, in Fall 2023.

Walters Hall is going through a lot of changes. Two of our lecturers dedicated to the teaching programs in the department have announced their retirement: Mr. William Burry and Mr. Sergiy Lavrykov.

Mr. Burry joined ESF in 1997 and has assisted and taught papermaking related courses. He developed a course, titled "Art and Early History of Papermaking" a first year requirement in Paper Engineering, including an Art Studio experience which became a very popular course across the campus. Students enjoy their time in this course exploring the papermaking arts while also learning about its history. The good news is that Mr. Burry has agreed to co-teach this course this coming Fall as a "guest" lecturer, so he can properly prepare the new instructor and keep his legacy going.

We also need to recognize Mr. Sergiy Lavrykov who joined the department in May 2001 as a research engineer in Prof. Ramarao's research group and has contributed greatly to the modeling and simulation of paper making processes area. Since 2018, Mr. Lavrykov has contributed by teaching courses in our paper engineering, bioprocess engineering and now chemical engineering programs. He teaches engineering thermodynamics, transport processes, process control, numerical methods, and simulations.

Lastly, but certainly not least, our Associate Professor Siddharth Chatterjee has also announced his well deserved retirement. Dr. Chatterjee has been in ESF for 29 years. He has actively engaged in the research areas of transport phenomena, design, simulation, pollution abatement. Quoting him from his retirement announcement He also remembers the inspiring students in his classes who "gave me much respect and affection, and the enlightening discussions with them on many topics over two and a half decades." Mr. Burry and Mr. Lavrykov, Dr. Chatterjee will certainly be missed by all the students, faculty, and staff.



Dr. Ankita Juneja has joined the Department as Assistant Professor in August 2023. Dr. Juneja earned her Ph.D. in Biological Engineering from Oregon State University, and MS in Agricultural Engineering from University of Georgia. She has extensive experience working in academia and industry, research, and teaching. Her research

focuses on integrating thermochemical, biochemical, and biological conversion pathways of biomass into sustainable production of value-added products and biofuels. She also works on nutrient recycling and carbon sequestration utilizing microalgae. Dr. Juneja is enthusiastic about engaging undergraduate and graduate students in her research. Dr. Juneja is excited to join ESF and looking forward to teaching Chemical Reaction Engineering & Process Safety in the Fall 2023 and Chemical Engineering Reaction Kinetics in Spring 2024. She is also looking forward to contributing to recruitment activities based on her experience as the Director of the Biotechnology program at Syracuse University.

The research engagement of our faculty members has increased tremendously. For 2021-2022, There was a total of 45 refereed publications and a total of \$1.15M was awarded in grants for all faculty and, \$450,000 was awarded from the US Department of Defense to Dr. Scott as PI. We are very excited with the scholarship and academic contribution of the recently hired assistant professors, Dr. Chang Yoo (hired in 2018) and Dr. Deepak Kumar (hired in 2019). Dr. Chang Yoo has received the National Science Foundation (NSF) early CAREER award, the most prestigious grant that NSF offers to earlycareer faculty. Dr. Kumar was listed in the world's top 2% cited scientists. His research focuses on sustainable bioprocess technologies for bioproducts, bioplastics, and biofuel from waste and forest residues. Dr. Kumar has published 70 journal articles.

The student life in our department has been immensely enriched by SUSChemE- Sustainable Chemical Engineering Club and AIChE (American Institute of Chemical Engineers)- ESF Student Chapter. They have brought together students from all our majors for fun activities such as pumpkin carving competitions, hand making paper, volleyball matches to professional tours in local mills. Several of our students attended the 2022 TAPPI/PIMA Student Summit, the 2022 Empire State TAPPI-PIMA Winter Conference and the 2022 AIChE Annual Meeting. In these events they were able to connect with fellow students from other institutions, industry professionals, and interview for summer and Co-Ops internships, as well as for permanent positions. The club member officials are also very committed and dedicated to their majors and don't measure efforts in helping the department with recruiting and outreach events.

The BS degree in Chemical Engineering was implemented in the Fall 2021 academic year. The goal of this program is to be a world leading center in chemical engineering applied for the understanding of sustainable resources, environmental stewardship, and responsible development through a focus on the science and engineering of biomolecular products and processes that are beneficial to society. In Fall 2022, we had 4 students enrolled in this new program. For that same year, 6 students enrolled in B.S. in Bioprocess Engineering and 3 students enrolled in B.S. in Paper Engineering.

We are happy to report that in the academic year, 2021-2022, we had 15 students awarded with B.S. in Bioprocess Engineering and 6 B.S. in Paper Engineering. We have also awarded 2 MPS, 2 MS and 2 Ph.D. degrees. Over the years, one of the highlights of this program is the high job placement and careers in the pulp, paper industry and related industries, as well great acceptance in well-renowned institutions. This academic year was no different and our student's accepted job positions in the industry with average starting salary for the class of 2022 was over \$76,000/year. Some of the graduate schools that our students were accepted included Columbia, Cornell, Duke, Northwestern, as well as SUNY-ESF. We helped celebrate their milestone in the commencement ceremony that was held for the first time at St. Joseph's Health Amphitheater at Lakeview.

Our continuous recruiting effort, with the help of SPPF and Admission's office, is making program. Fall 2023 - 17 domestic students are enrolled as first year : 4 students enrolled in B.S. in Bioprocess Engineering, 8 students enrolled in B.S. in Paper Engineering and 9 students enrolled in B.S. in Chemical Engineering. We are also welcoming 25 students from Beijing University of Chemical Technology, for their senior year in Bioprocess Engineering.

Looking ahead, all department members will be very busy getting ready for the Accreditation of the Chemical Engineering program and the reaccreditation of the Bioprocess Engineering and Paper Engineering in the next cycle, 2024.

We are positive that the sustainability message brought by the Department Chemical Engineering will resonate with prospective students, as well as the several other opportunities offered by these programs. We are looking forward to our next academic year and to continuing this essential partnership with the Syracuse Pulp and Paper Foundation.
